# History of the Loveland Symmes Fire Department

Lunch and Learn Wednesday, April 12; 11:30 – 2:00

How did our local fire department evolve from an allvolunteer staff to the outstanding department we have today?

Chief Huber will present an informative talk about the history and growth of the department, first organized in 1877, called "Hook and Ladder Brigade".



According to *Passages Through Time*, in 1885, the Miami Steam Engine, Hose, Hook & Ladder Co. was organized with A. B. Brock as the first chief. The first steam engine was purchased for \$700 that same year.



He has been active with many local and area wide organizations, featured speaker for many firehouse conferences, and published in several Fire Department magazines. # "The Doolittle Raid – An Incredible Story of Courage"

LMC is fortunate to have Rick Rosesel return to tell an incredible story that's in danger of being lost to the ages.



While widely celebrated during WW II, with each successive generation this story becomes more obscure.

The Doolittle Raid, also known as Tokyo Raid, took place on April 18, 1942, a few months after the Pearl Harbor attack. It was the first American air operation to strike the Japanese archipelago. It was led by Lieutenant Colonel James Doolittle.

# LMC applies for Historic Landmark Designation

The City of Loveland became a Certified :Local Government (CLG) district after many months of work by the Historic Preservation Commission (GLHS is represented on the commission) in 2021. The boundaries include the main business district in Clermont County,

The task of the commission is to review plans for renovations or new construction to establish that plans meet certain guidelines that fit into the historic area.

Several historic sites have also been designated part of the CLG, including White Pillars and two family cemeteries – Ramsey Paxton & Hill. Plaques are given to each site and the property is now eligible for potential grants or tax credits.

The Loveland Museum Center has completed the application for this Historic Landmark – thanks to Peggy Goodwin who wrote the narrative and organized the pictures (from our extensive files of old pictures). The commission will be meeting soon to approve this application.

This picture dates to late 1920's when Dr. Frank Lever



and family lived here (note the wrap-around porch).

Records indicate that the property dates to 1861 when Samuel Smith conveyed 97 acres to Dr. John Stephens Law who was a senior member of Law's Insurance Agency and the father of Loveland's first mayor. In 1862 Dr. Law built his residence, named Bonaventure, featuring the Italianate style, painted light brown with dark brown trim.

John Hill Construction is using these old pictures for design purposes.

# **Hearts Afire**Valentine Weekend February 10 – 12

Valentine's Day holds special significance for Loveland. In 1972, Doris Pfiester began stamping valentines with a special Loveland Postmark – 36 cards the first year. Articles in many papers published the service, which had expanded to more than 10,000 valentines by the early 1990's. The Chamber of Commerce took over the project in 1989, expanding the program by choosing a new Valentine Lady each year, a Valentine Breakfast, and a yearly Valentine Card design contest.

This year's celebration kicks off with the annual Valentine breakfast at the Oasis – register with the Little Miami River Chamber Alliance. The other multiple activities can be found at the City of Loveland WEB page – many require registration.

# Nancy Ford Cones and "The Big Picture"

The Taft Museum's exhibition, Craft and Camera: The Art of Nancy Ford Cones, closed on January 15, 2023 after being [part of the Sixth FotoFocus Biennial; Art Program in Cincinnati. The collaborative 2022 Biennial Exhibition was the largest to date with over 600 participants and 2000 passport tickets distributed.

As a result of the success of the Taft's exhibition and a recommendation from University of Cincinnati Professor and local Loveland resident Dr. Theresa Leininger-Miller, Nancy Ford Cones and her work will be highlighted in a three-hour film documentary series entitled, *The Big Picture: A History of Photography in Greater Cincinnati*, to be released in early 2025.

The documentary examines the role of photography in the development of Greater Cincinnati and will focus upon regional photographers, their choice of subjects, and the ways in which their photography impacted the Greater Cincinnati region socially, economically, politically, and culturally from 1839-1939. The series is presented chronologically to reflect the relationships between the development of photography, and the emergence of Greater Cincinnati from a small Mid- West River town to a major commercial center.

According to Project Director Tom Law, of the Voyageur Media Group, Inc. Cones' and her work will be profiled primarily during the period of 1910-1939. The Loveland Museum Center is proud to be a part of this educational endeavor.
